Es investigadora del Centro de Investigaciones sobre América del Norte (CISAN), de la Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM), en donde fungió como directora entre 2009 y agosto de 2017. Sus temas de especialidad son las relaciones políticas México-Estados Unidos; la desigualdad social y de género en América del Norte y la migración y los procesos electorales en Estados Unidos. Funge como catedrática de la División de Relaciones Internacionales de la Facultad de Ciencias Políticas y Sociales de la UNAM. Cuenta con estudios de posgrado en Sociología por la misma Facultad. Ha sido reconocida como investigadora asociada por el Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies de Michigan State University y ha realizado estancias de investigación en instituciones del extranjero, tales como Georgetown University y la Jawaharlal Nehru University, en Nueva Delhi, India. Asimismo, fue distinguida en 1999 como Fellow del Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars de Estados Unidos.

Actualmente es miembro del Consejo Directivo de la Red Internacional Metropolis; miembro del Advisory Board del Mexico Institute, del Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars de Estados Unidos; miembro del Consejo Asesor del North American Research Partnership (NARP) y vicepresidenta de la Asociación Mexicana de Estudios Internacionales (AMEI).

Silvia has been director of the center since 2009, and her period ended in August 2017. Her area of expertise include Mexico-United States political relations; social and gender inequality in North America; and migration and electoral processes in the United States. She has been recognized as an associate researcher at the Michigan State University Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies. She has been a visiting scholar at several prestigious universities, such as Georgetown University, Washington, D.C.; and Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, India. She was also declared a junior fellow of the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in Washington, D.C. in 1999. She is currently a member of the International Steering Committee of the International Metropolis Project; of the Advisory Board of the

Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars Mexico Institute; and of the Advisory Council of the North American Research Partnership (NARP); as well as vice-president of the Mexican Association of International Studies (AMEI).
